

Facilities Operative

The facilities team serve a vital purpose ensuring cleaning, maintenance and management services are delivered in a confident, efficient and timely manner with least interruption to patrons. Their hard work greatly relieves the pressure on staff working directly with service users.

Opportunities

Facilities Operatives provide a wide variety of services including security, maintenance or engineering, cleaning, catering, logistics, postal service, storage management and risk assessments. Facilities teams within hospitality settings strongly focus on maintaining the security of staff and patrons, cleanliness of all areas and safe storage of vital equipment. Experience as a cleaner or within facilities can lead to becoming a Facilities Manager, alternatively you could set up your own cleaning or facilities management business.

For those starting out as a Cleaner, salaries range from £15,000 in an entry-level role, raising to £19,000 with experience. As a Facilities Operative, you can expect to earn a salary starting at £18,500 which rising to £25,500 p.a with experience. Progression into a Facilities Manager job role can come with a salary earning up to £60,000 with experience.



Requirements

Some experience working within cleaning or facilities may be required within some settings. A good standard of education including maths, English or ICT qualifications at GCSE grade 4 (grade C in the previous structure) is recommended due to the nature of the work. Additionally, you may be required to demonstrate familiarity with in-house facilities management systems. You'll work proactively with all departments, having strong communication and interpersonal skills, and ensure the relevant health, safety and environmental legislation are in place.
